Declaration on the use of "Conflict Minerals"

The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission adopted a new form and rule Pursuant to Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the Act) relating to the use of conflict minerals.

This law forces electronic companies and their distributors to disclose the use of conflict minerals which include tantalum, tin, tungsten, or gold (3T+G) if those minerals are necessary for the functionality or production of the product. Section 1502 of the Act was enacted because of concerns that the exploitation and trade of conflict minerals by armed groups helping to finance conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo DRC region.

The Haug Electronic Components GmbH is fully aware about the value of ecological and social responsibility. As a distributor of electronic components, we promote the traceability of these minerals and the transparency of the supply chain.

We are committed working with our suppliers to supply products that meet the customer's specifications. These important information's on the use of conflict minerals in the technology supply chain is being compiled by the Electronics Components Industry Association and the Electronics Industry Citizenship Coalition.
